Dear Friends,

February is the month of love. Or at least, that's what the shops tell us, with their ever-increasing range of Valentine's cards, roses and red hearts. Valentine's Day encourages us to think about the people we love but, with Ash Wednesday falling on 22 February, this month could also help us to think about the time we give to ourselves.

As I reflect on this month I ask myself: what do I love doing and do I give myself time to do it?

my cacti or the buds in the garden waiting with great anticipation to flower.

#### Nature notes: What to see and hear in February?

Spring is round the corner with longer and occasional warmer days. Look out for early butterflies and queen bumblebees enticed out of hibernation by the sun. Birds are pairing up and looking at potential nesting sites – it's not too late to put up a bird box in your garden or local park (with permission). Early spring wild flowers appear including the wayside-dwelling starry yellow celandine and purple lesser periwinkle.



Listen out for great spotted woodpeckers drumming on tree trunks high up. They are establishing their breeding territory. You may hear two drumming male woodpeckers trying to outdo each other.

# What to cook in February? Apple and Marmalade Pudding (serves 6) Ingredients

3 medium cooking apples peeled and chopped (more if you prefer - you could use up to half in eating apples)

2 tbs marmalade

1 tbs light soft brown sugar (preferably muscovado)

#### Ingredients for the sponge topping

175g softened butter or margarine plus extra for the dish 150g caster sugar 175g self-raising flour 3 eggs & grated rind of an orange

#### Method

Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 Butter a 20 x 30cm rectangular baking dish (or another of equivalent size) and put in the apples mixed with



marmalade and brown sugar. In a separate bowl, cream the margarine and sugar together until pale, light and fluffy. Add the eggs a little at a time and beat until absorbed. Sift in the flour and salt, add orange rind and gently fold in until mixed. Alternatively, put all the ingredients into a food processor to mix. Spread the sponge mixture in an even layer over the apples. Bake until the sponge is golden brown and springs back into shape when gently pressed (about 40 minutes).












#### **Dementia Inclusive service**

#### **Old Marston Parish Council report**

The January PC meeting had no concerns with planning applications from 4 Haynes Road, 142 Oxford Road and Court Place Farm (Marsh Lane). OCC informed the PC that an application from the Red Lion has been refused, while those from 19 Arlington Drive, 26 Cavendish Drive and 2 Lewell Avenue have been approved.

The PC is looking into activities available to elderly residents of the parish; results of the ensuing report will be publicised.

The PC has agreed to support the Debate Not Hate campaign, organised by the Local Government Association. Democracy thrives on good, frank discussion, which should never turn into personal abuse. Debating and disagreeing with one another is a healthy part of democracy, but abuse and intimidation are not. The PC will challenge any abuse against councillors and uphold standards of debate at its meetings. The vulnerability of elected representatives has been at the forefront in recent times: witness the murders of MPs Jo Cox and Sir David Amess. Anyone, regardless of their political affiliation, should feel safe to become a councillor and be proud to represent their community.

A revised calendar of meetings for PC and committee meetings in 2023 has been agreed. Full PC meetings remain scheduled for 6 Feb, 6 Mar, 3 Apr, 15 May, 5 June, 3 July, 4 Sep, 2 Oct, 6 Nov & 4 Dec at 7pm. Other committees meet on the last Monday of each month at 6pm.

The next OXCLEAN litter pick will be on **Sat 4 Mar 2023**: a reminder will be posted on the noticeboard and website nearer the time. Please do join us as we would love to see you and you will be making a difference to our community.

The next full PC meeting will be on Mon 6 Feb at 7pm at Mortimer Hall; the Pavilion, Recreation Grounds, Allotments and Cemetery committee meets on Mon 27 Feb at 6pm at Mortimer Hall.
