#### NEWS FROM DIVYA SHANTHI IN BANGALORE

The school survived 2021-22 of online classes with about 25% of children dropping out. The new year began in May 2022 with record admissions to about 500 students. To catch up, we provided extra support with classes before and after regular hours and on weekends. We are beginning to see the results in improved performance. The Special Needs School is at capacity with 45 children. A new feature this year is a training program for parents to partnering in their child's development. After a break of five years, the feeder school at Lingarajapuram reopened with 33 children. They came from very poor homes but have defied expectations in doing very well, especially in learning English. These children hardly ever miss school.

This has been a very encouraging year for our Vocational Training Unit which has expanded rapidly as we partner with the Rotary Club of Bangalore and others. Tailoring, cooking classes and sanitary pad manufacturing, soft skills training for the physically disabled, placed with Amazon, Shell supermarkets, Home based products making like candle making and baking cakes etc., for people with special needs,

community health worker training and elder care training.

The Community Health Centre has also grown rapidly with a team of two doctors (part-time), three nurses and one community health worker. We added a fully equipped physiotherapy unit in June with a part time experienced physiotherapist. This serves people who are unable to pay for treatment and lose employment or miss many days of work. Most are in work that is physically intensive labour. Training for carers and eight of our staff is completed and with portable kits, physiotherapy is being provided at home or in our outreach centres.

Health conducted camps were every month. Some had corporate sponsorship that enabled us to assist diabetics from low-income families and provide spectacles for those who attended the eye camp. We serve about 7500 patients, including those recently declared free from leprosy and living on the streets and surviving by begging, men and women who have recovered from tuberculosis and need medical and nutritional support and transgender people who live in small groups of 20-25 and earn their livelihood by begging. We meet the needs of these communities in partnership with the Corporation health unit we provide nutrition support to over 100 children and 250 adults.

Rehabilitation work with alcoholics was low key this year and hopefully will grow next year. The National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro Sciences is ready to work with us and the municipal health team but we need to find the right person to lead this work.


