


Risen indeed!

It may sometimes be hard to believe that there will be better times. It may, at times, be hard to feel blessed by our seasonal and maritime climate. But our springtime journey through Lent and Easter is a most powerful gift to offer us that hope. As I write this in mid-March, we have just celebrated the Spring equinox with an evening service in the vicarage garden. Although pleased that my umbrella hadn't proved necessary, a strong wind seemed determined to remind us, gathered round the fire for prayers, poems and reflections on the meaning, the




of the balance, season, that winter would try to return. Indeed we often experience a little Oxford snowfall in April, adding different source of white to the blackthorn and cherry blossom of the Spring palette.

But there, on that evening in the vicarage garden, I was struck by the birdsong. Despite the fading light, a blackbird sang loud and clear from the vicarage rooftop. Not the clucking of the blackbird's usual evening chorus, but the full Spring song of a dawn chorus.

Others, some more distant, sang also: a goldcrest and a goldfinch, a coal tit and a green woodpecker,



and at least three robins. Usually the last to be heard as evening falls, one nearby robin proved faithful to that promise and continued long after the blackbird had fallen silent. Winter


has passed, they were saying, Spring is here, your Lenten journey is nearing its end, beloved pilgrim: Christ is risen.

Inexorably it seems, whatever the news of the world, nature will rise again as winter passes. It is no coincidence that Easter falls at this seasonal transition time, as Passover marks our transition from bondage to freedom, from guilt to forgiveness. For Christ is the incarnate spirit of that very life force that has transformed the Earth into a blue pearl shining brightly in the inky blackness.

So the world turns, and Spring must and will come again. Take heart then, for the resurrection hope is not only found in the emergence of the Spring bulbs that we planted together. We find it also in the deep wisdom that founded the bulb's mutual dependence on fungi to help feed it and insects to help it propagate. Here is reflected a love in creation that is beyond our understanding.

In my professional life I read many arguments

for why we need nature. Yet somehow, the most obvious and important reason often gets lost in the earnestly delivered scientific explanations about ecosystems, biodiversity, Gaia and the functioning of our immune systems. Of course we need nature for all those reasons, and indeed it is a human conceit to not realise that we need nature more than it needs us. But I believe t

Nature notes: What to see and hear in April?

April is a busy month for wildlife with the nesting season well underway. You may see birds carrying nest material in their beaks. Blackbirds may already have reared their first brood (they typically have two or three broods during the year). You may find a newly-fledged blackbird with its downy feathers in your garden. The parents will be close by keeping watch.



Frothy white blackthorn blossom with its heady scent appears in hedgerows and is an important source of pollen and nectar for insects. Swallows start to arrive this month after their long journey from the southern hemisphere.

What to make in April? No churn ice cream for Grown Ups.



Ingredients

1 x 397ml can condensed milk

1 x 600ml pot double cream

5 tbsp instant coffee powder (the expensive sort that contains coffee granules)

4/5 tbsp coffee expresso liqueur cocktail drink. Method

Whisk all the ingredients together until soft peaks form and you have a caffe-latte-coloured airy mixture. Pour into 4x500ml/4 x 1-pint airtight containers and freeze for at least 6 hours. Serve straight from the freezer. You can make half the quantity if freezer space is tight. Store the leftover condensed milk in an airtight container in the fridge.
