#### What to quote in May?

On the Dance of the Mayfly by Alexander Pope Some to the sun their insect-wings unfold, Waft on the breeze, or sink in clouds of gold. Transparent forms, too fine for mortal sight, Their fluid bodies half dissolv'd in light. Loose to the winds their airy garments flew, Thin glitt'ring textures of the filmy dew; Dipt in the richest tincture of the skies, Where light disports in ever-mingling dies, While ev'ry beam new transient colours flings, Colours that change whene'er they wave their wings.

#### Nature notes: What to see and hear in May?

May is the month of peak birdsong, celebrated on International Dawn Chorus Day on Sun 7 May. Why not go for an early morning walk to experience nature's greatest symphony? Or just open your window at



dawn to hear the birds in your patch. It's "no mow May", an opportunity to leave some or all your lawn un-mown and see what grows or visits. On warm days look out for the pretty orange-tip butterfly. Their caterpillars feed on cuckoo flower and hedge garlic, the latter also known as Jack by the hedge.

Swifts return this month – listen out for their screaming parties at dusk.

#### What to make in May Easy tiramisu Ingredients

1 tbsp good quality instant coffee granules
2 tbsp Tia Maria/own brand coffee liqueur/brandy
2 x 250g tubs Mascarpone cheese
1 x 500g carton fresh custard
100g grated dark chocolate.
1 packet of sponge fingers



#### Method

Mix coffee with sugar and 300ml boiling water, then add Tia Maria. In a separate bowl, beat mascarpone until soft, then gradually beat in the custard. Dip half the sponge fingers in the coffee mixture and use to line a serving dish. I prefer an oblong one. Sprinkle a third of the chocolate over the biscuits, then half the custard mixture. Then do the same again to repeat the layers. Sprinkle the rest of the chocolate on the top. Cover with cling film and chill for at least one hour in the fridge before serving. Decorate with fruit to taste.

#### **Old Marston Library volunteers**





#### **Old Marston Parish Council report**

Firstly, the PC would like to wish you an enjoyable Coronation Bank Holiday: it hopes that any celebrations are both enjoyable and successful.

At the April meeting the PC looked at planning applications from 60 Cherwell Drive and the old changing rooms at Court Place Farm in Marsh Lane. The PC had no concerns with the applications: indeed, it saw the proposal for the Marsh Lane changing rooms as potentially an asset for the whole community. OCC has notified the PC that the application for 46 Oxford Road has been approved.

At the time of writing there has been no further news regarding either of the planning applications for Almonds Farm (land West of Mill Lane) or Hill View Farm. The most recent information was that the judge in charge of the judicial review had not made a decision.

The NO DOGS signs disappeared from the fences of Mortimer Hall Recreation Ground and Boults Lane Recreation Ground. They have now been replaced by new ones.

The PC has re-introduced the deposit of £50 for a burial in the cemetery. The deposit will be returned only if all wreaths and other obstructions to mowing have been removed from the burial ground within four weeks of the date of internment.

The Community Needs survey will be distributed to all households within the parish as soon as we have received it from the printers. We would like as many people as possible as to respond to give us the fullest information on their views.

The PC will have a stall at the Love Marston, Love Life event on Mortimer Hall Recreational Ground on Sun 21 May.

Due to the various Bank Holidays this month, the annual PC meeting will be on Mon 15 May at 7pm and the annual parishioners meeting will be on Mon 22 May at 7pm, both at Mortimer Hall. All are welcome.

Full PC meetings are scheduled for 3 Apr, 15 May, 5 June, 3 July, 4 Sep, 2 Oct, 6 Nov & 4 Dec at 7pm at Mortimer Hall. Other committees meet there on the last Monday of each month at 6pm.
