### **Nature notes: What to see and hear in July?**

July is a great month for spotting butterflies and moths. These important pollinators are in decline and need our help. One way to help them is to garden in a more wildlife friendly way. Here are some ideas: grow nectar-rich flowers such as evening primrose, lavender and marjoram (these can also be grown in pots); let



plants die back at the end of the summer - they provide a home for caterpillars and chrysalises; leave an untended patch for wildlife to enjoy; provide water, a large saucer or two will help. Finally, you could take part in the Big Butterfly Count which runs from 11 July to 4 August:

### **What not to cook in July?**

#### **Tiramisu**

Ingredients

200ml double cream

250g mascarpone cheese

175g sponge finger biscuits

70g castor sugar

150ml strong cooled coffee

20ml Amaretto or Coffee cocktail drink ( optional)

40g unsweetened cocoa powder

## Method

Find a square or oblong dish which is the same size as half the biscuits. You can cut them to size. Make the coffee and leave to cool. Thoroughly mix the sugar and mascarpone cheese together. Whip the double cream and fold it into the cheese mixture a little at a time. In



a separate dish mix the coffee and Amaretto/cocktail drink together and then dip half the sponge fingers for 1-2 seconds each before placing them in a single layer in your dish. Spread half the cheese mixture evenly

over the sponge fingers. Then repeat. Place in the fridge for at least 2 hours and when ready to serve sprinkle cocoa powder over the top.

## Oxfordshire Army Cadets - Headington detachment

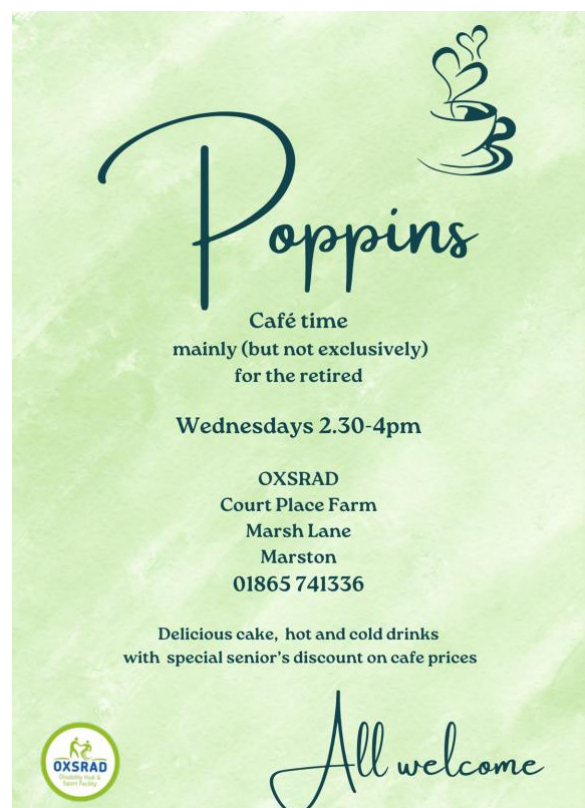



## Bellringers' report - July 2024

Following the recent passing of our friend and ringer Andy Dunn, we were saddened to learn that two other ringers, Kate Crennell and Ron Burgess, the Tower Captains of All Saints, Chilton and St Mary's, Kidlington respectively, have also passed within the past month. Both highly respected ringers, they were always on-hand for ringing and in their honour many quarter peals have been rung across the area. St Nicholas' contributions were on 26 May (24 method variations) for Kate and 9 June (21 method variations) for Ron.

In lighter news, many of our ringers have joined others for a plethora of quarter peals throughout the branch, as well as supporting ringing at other churches for their fetes, which has been followed by partaking in a cake or two. The latest daytime practice at Bletchington has seen a greater number of Minor methods being attempted and a great number in attendance.

We're often asked by visitors whether anything can go wrong in ringing – usually the big question is 'Will the rope take me up into the ceiling?' Unlikely at Marston (we're actually one of the best towers to learn at). That's not to say things don't happen, and typically it took place on the occasion of honouring D-Day. Our tenor bell rope frayed 10 minutes into the ring and was put out of action as a result. No injuries sustained. Not to be outdone, a swift restart occurred and 10 method variations were rung with the remaining five bells.

If you fancy the challenge of ringing with us, do pop along on a Friday or contact us and we'll answer questions beforehand.

## Old Marston Parish Council report for June

At the May PC meeting there were no objections to planning applications from Ibstock, 1 Pond Lane, 6 Oxford Road, 30 Elms Drive, 50 Raymund Road. The PC raised various concerns to applications from 14 Salford Road, 22 Raymund Road and Colthorn Farm.

Oxford CC has advised that applications from 82 Arlington Drive, 1 Fairfax Avenue, 3 Little Acreage, 95 Oxford Road and 52 Oxford Road have been approved, while those from 27 Marsh Lane, 44 Arlington Drive and 14 Beechey Avenue were refused. The application for 1A Mill Lane has been withdrawn.

The traffic survey has been carried out and the PC will be reviewing the findings. There were some issues of vandalism with the equipment which didn't help the collection of valuable data.

Dr Peter Williams stood down from the PC after the June meeting. Peter has been a parish councillor since October 2011 and a valuable part of the council and resident of Old Marston. Everyone on the PC wishes Peter well for the future and hope to see him at a future meeting as a member of the public.

At the annual parishioners meeting in May several issues raised concerned antisocial behaviour, vandalism and the overgrown and dangerous grass verges within the parish amongst other concerns. All the issues raised will be discussed in the relevant committee meetings and any proposals brought to the full council for consideration.

The next meeting will be on **Monday 1 July at 7pm** in the Mortimer Hall.
